

2023-2024 FAFSA

- Available October 1, 2022
- Current school codes remain until ED approves merger
- One FAFSA School Code upon approval
 - 11 remaining school codes cease to exist to students

Pledge to Advance Connecticut (PACT)

 Arguably one of the most generous free community college programs in the country

- 2021 Cohort: 3,911 students, 366 graduates
 - Two-Year Graduation Rate of 9.4%
 - Three-Year Graduation Rate ... TBD

- 3,911 Total Students
- Average EFC
 - 12,211
- Average Family Income
 - \$78,620

2021-22

- 5,958 Total Students (62% New)
- Average EFC
 - 13,579
- Average Family Income
 - \$82,118
- 55% White
- 29% Hispanic/Latino
- 14% Black/African American



- Changes for 2022-2023
 - Open to part-time students of at least 6 credits
 - Extension of timeframe from 36 months to 48 months
 - Potential to include more than 3,000 additional students

- Funding
 - 2022-2023: \$15 million appropriated
 - Beyond: Up to \$14 million annually in net proceeds from online lottery games



- Total Appeals 397
 - 31% Already Eligible
 - 53% Approved
 - 13% Not Approved
 - 3% Pending Review

- Decrease in Student Debt
 - AY1920: \$9.8 million
 - AY2021: \$6.0 million
 - AY2122: \$3.7 million
